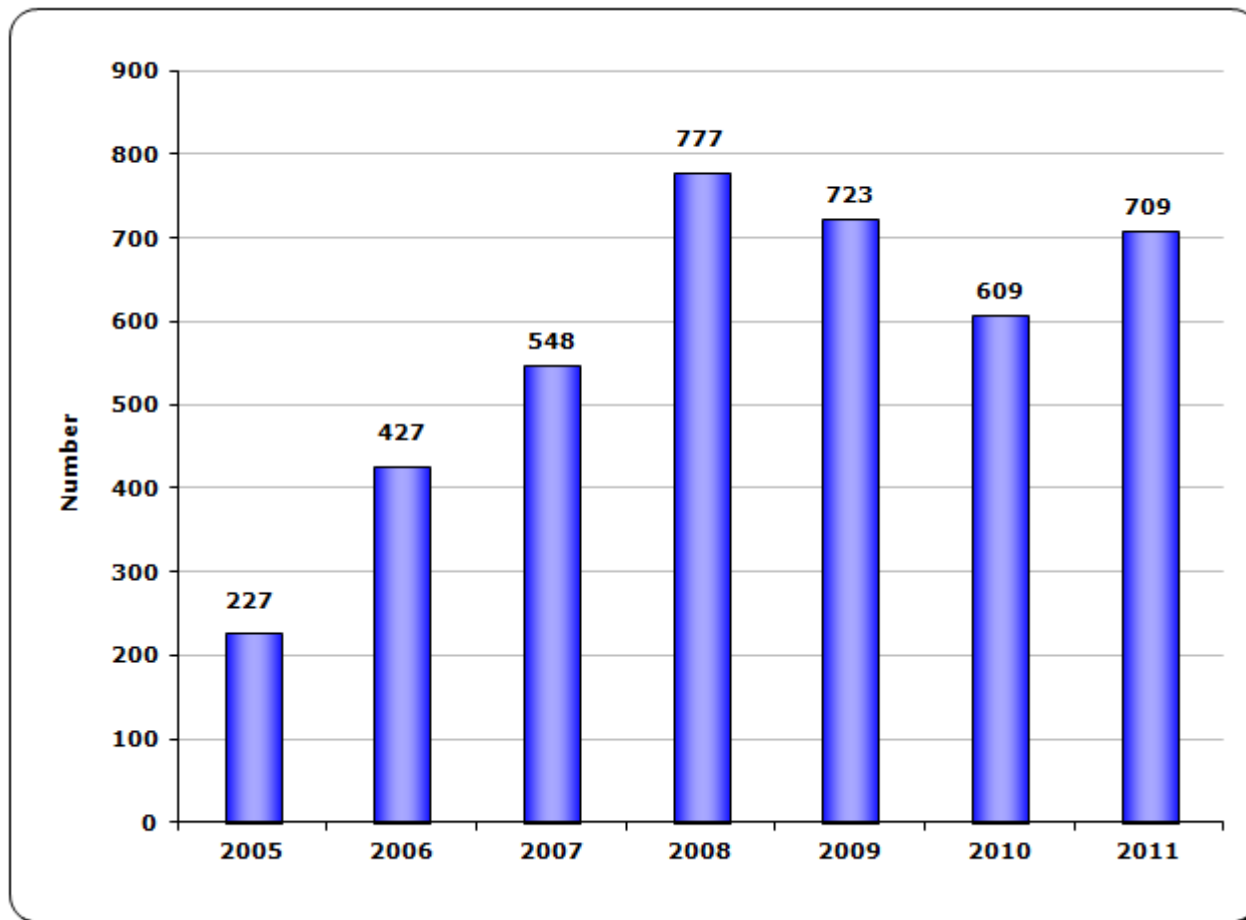
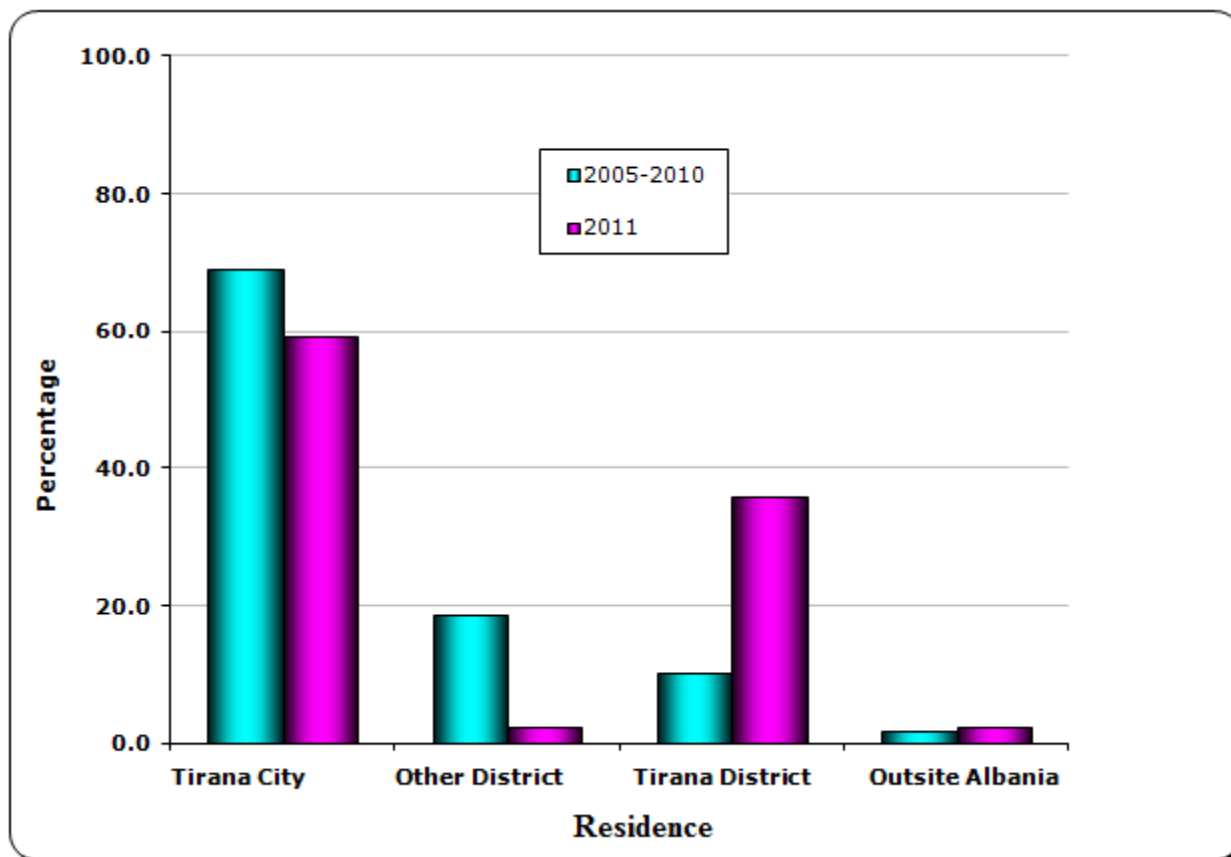


Number of clients of Roma minority 2005-20101



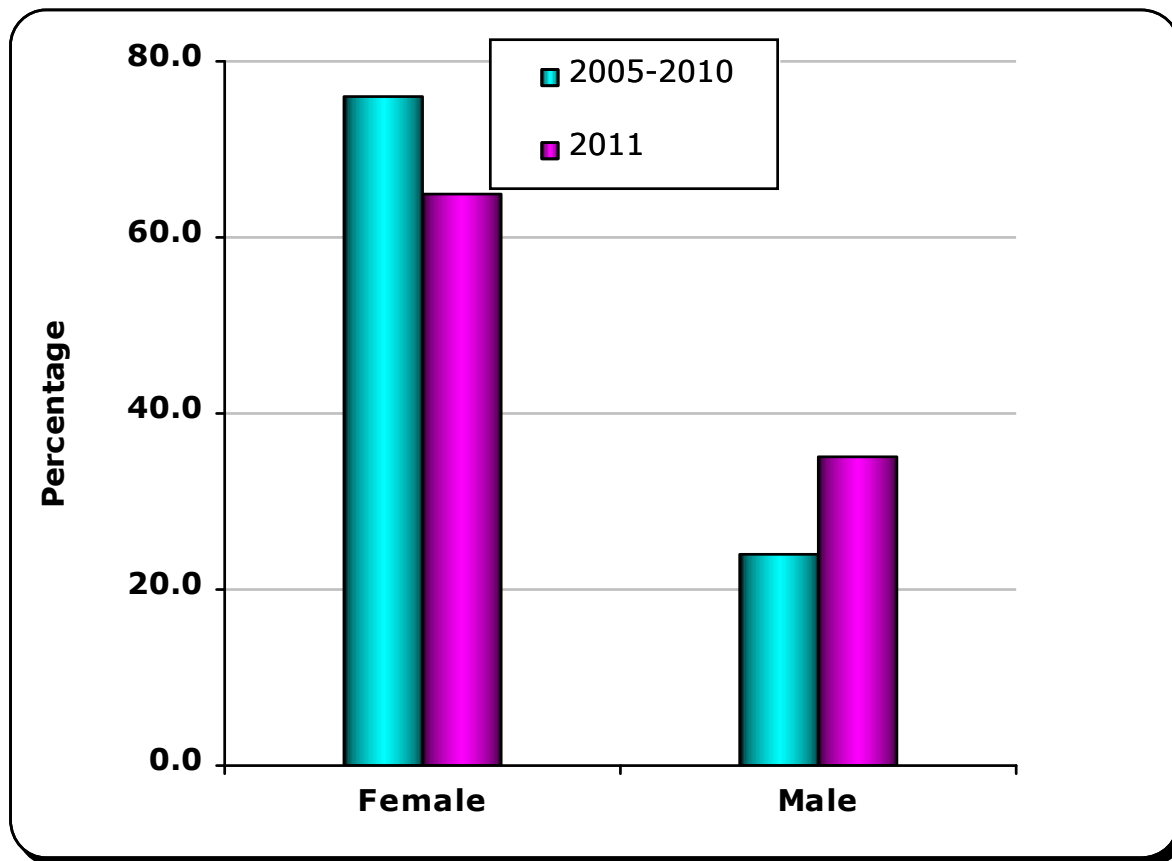
By comparing the same time periods, it is noted that the number of Roma minority clients has increased by 17% in 2011 compared to 2010.

In 2011, it has increased the number of the Roma families living in the District of Tirana and it has decreased the number of the Roma families living in the City of Tirana.

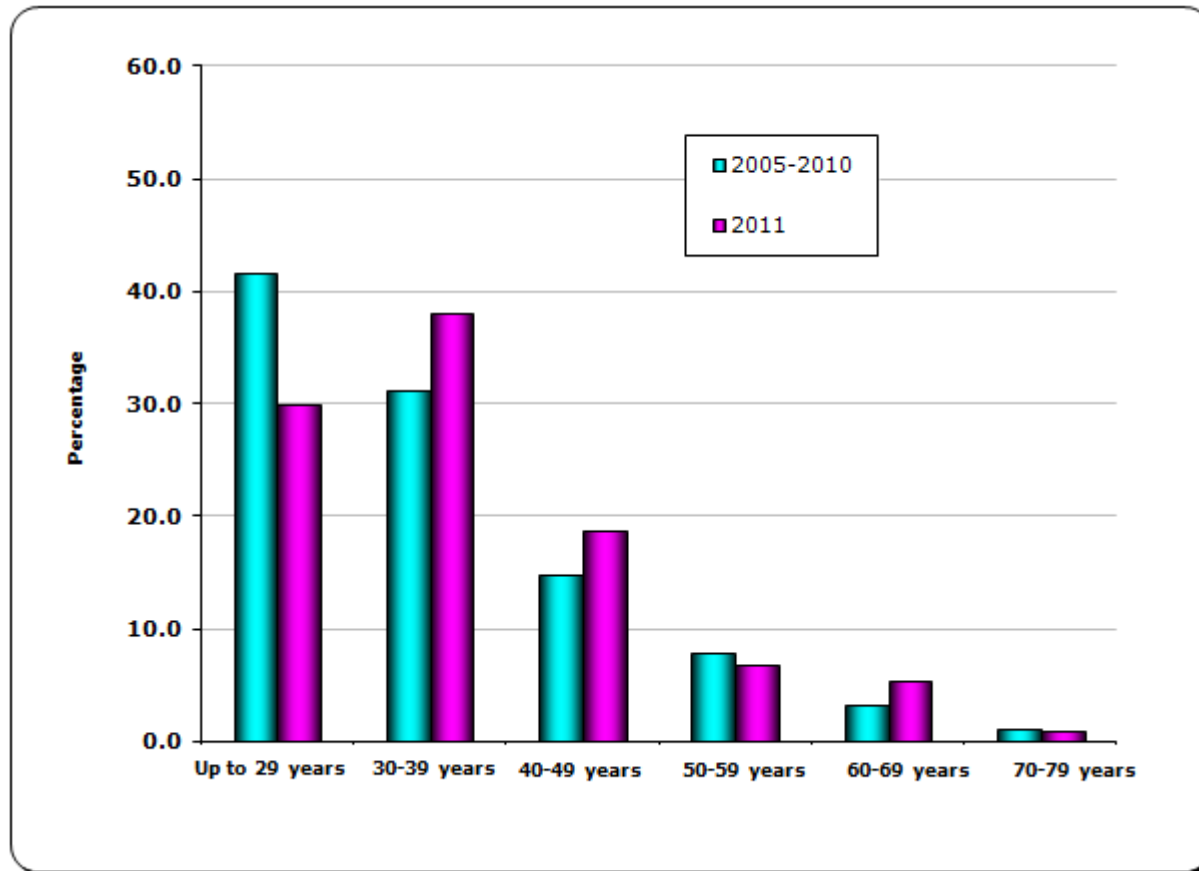
Structure of Roma clients by gender 2005-2010 and 2011

Compared to 2005 – 2010, in 2011, the number of the male clients has increased.

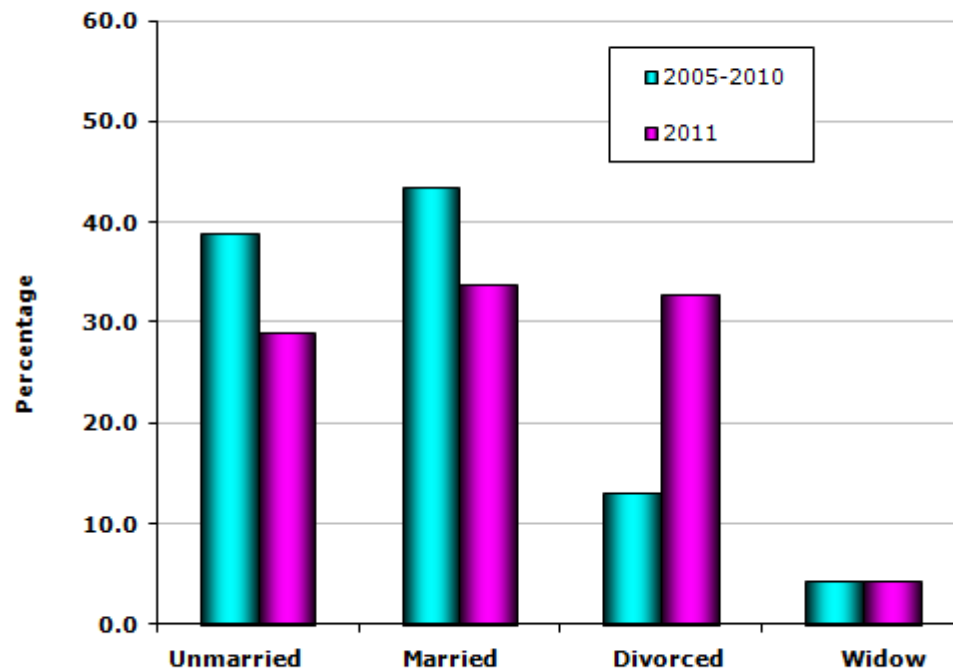
Structure of Roma clients by age 2005-2010 and 2011

age 30-39 years old.

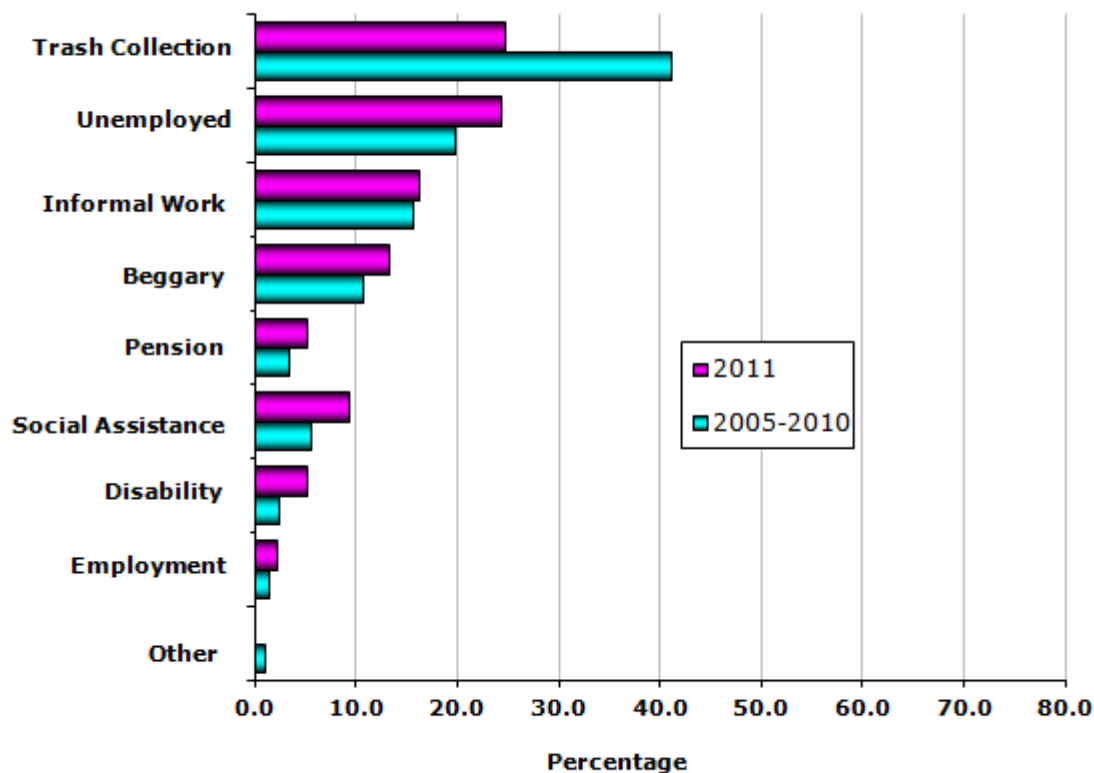
In 2011, it is noted an

In 2011 it is noted a considerable increase of the divorced families needing more assistance and support.

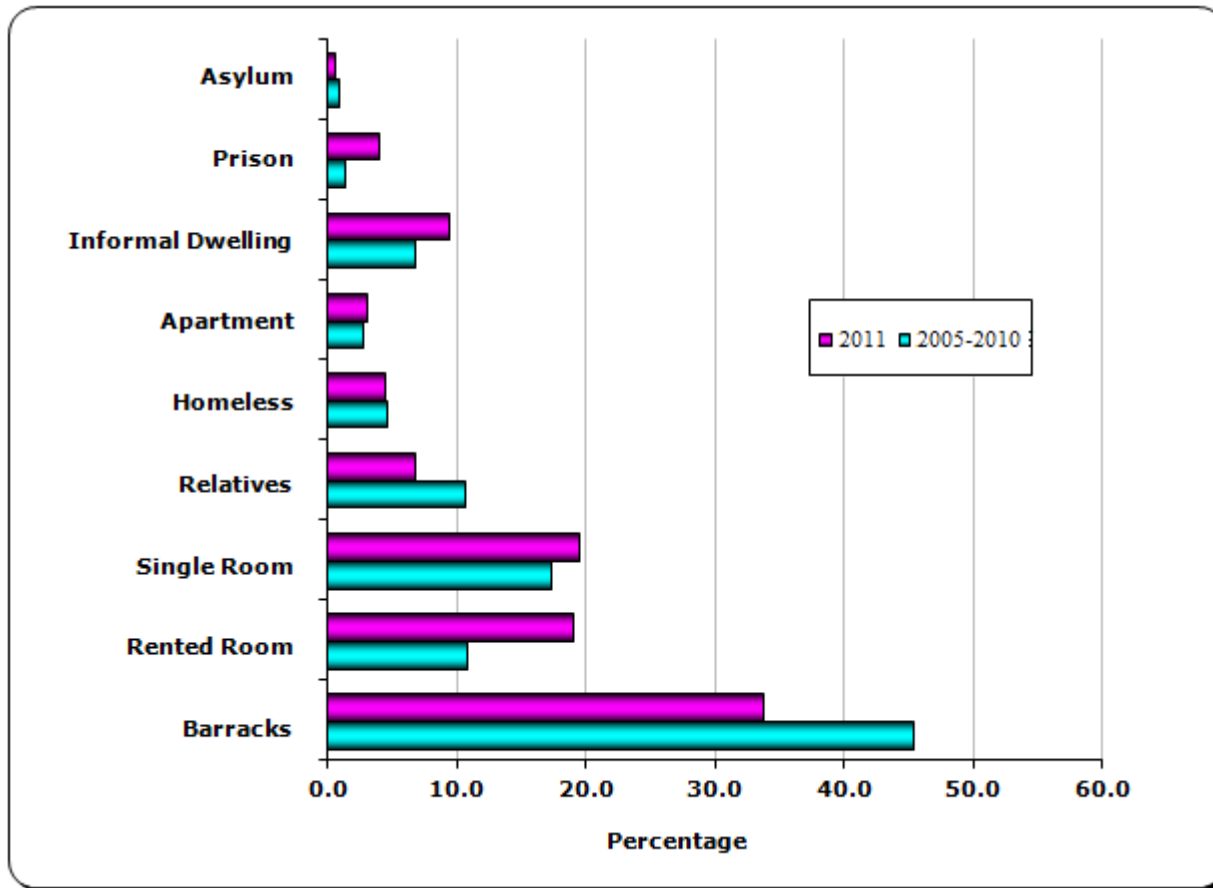
Structure of Roma clients source of income 2005-2010 and 2011

It has increased the number of clients benefiting social insurance or disability pension.

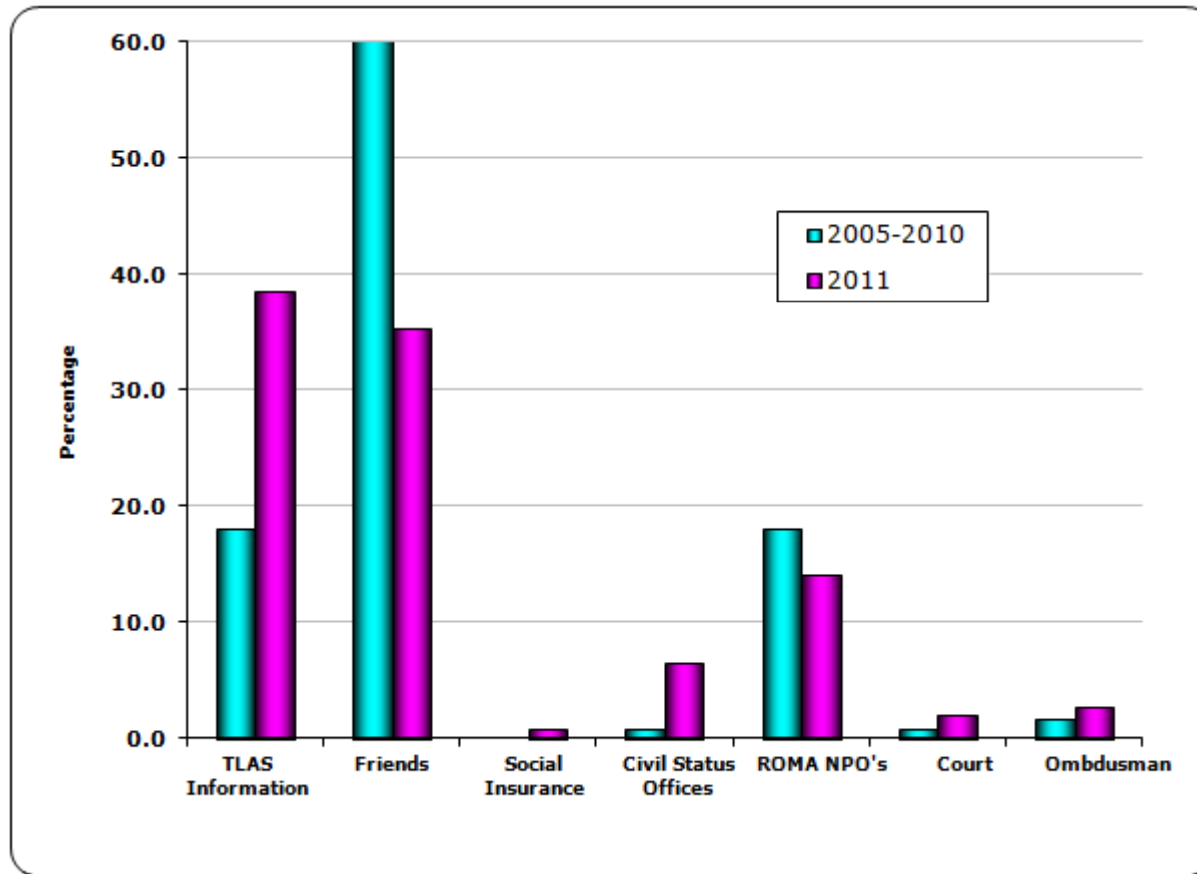
Structure of Roma clients by habitations conditions 2005-2010 and 2011

It is noted the same number of Roma clients identified as homeless or those living in apartments.

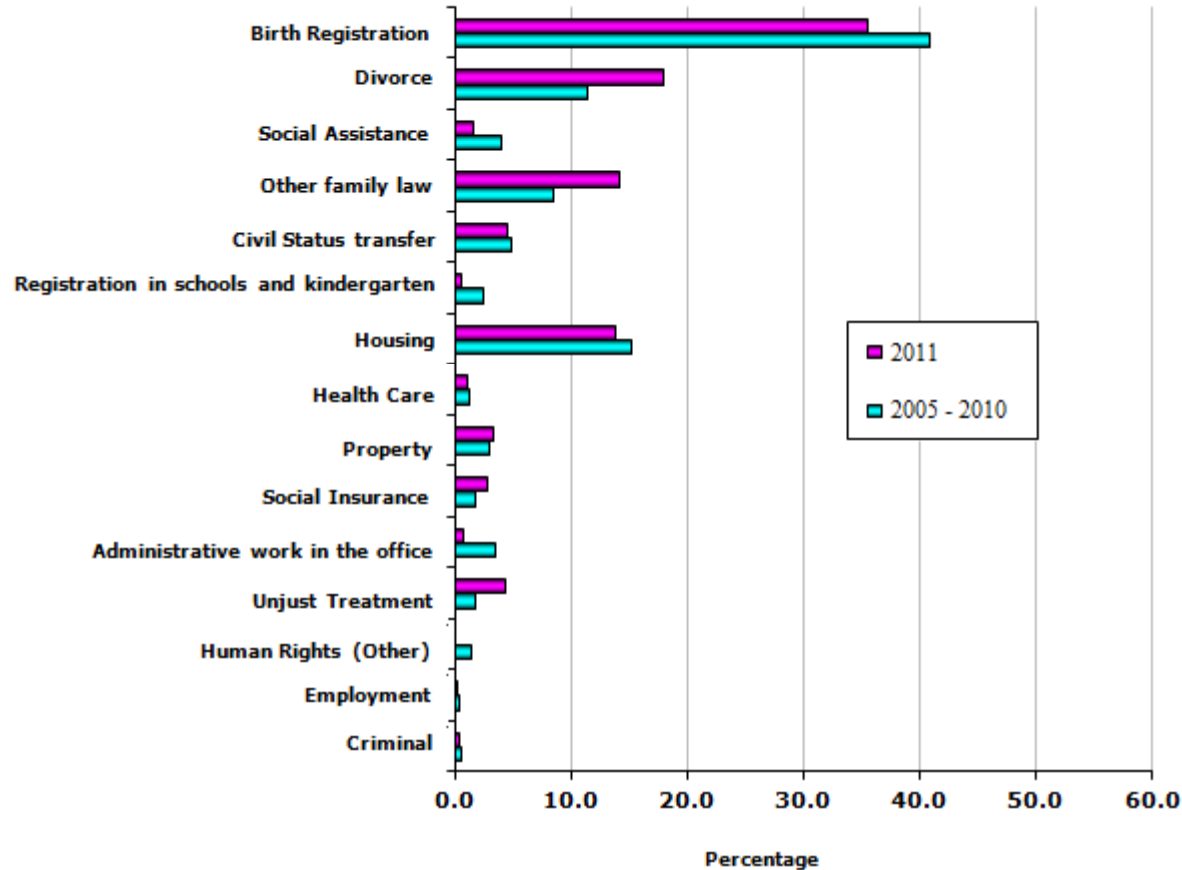
Source of information of Roma clients on the existence of TLAS 2005-2010 and 2011

Other sources of information are TLAS publications and Roma NGO's.

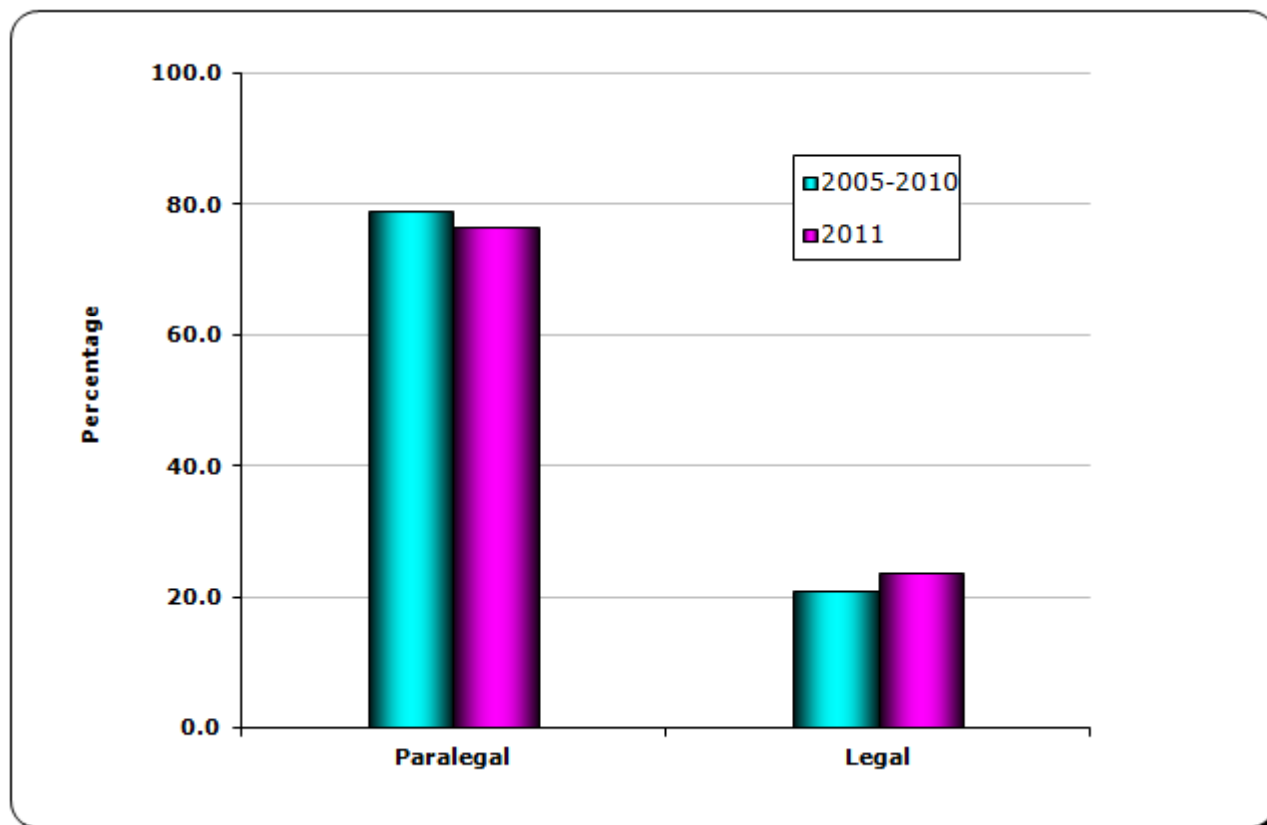
Roma Minority Problems 2005-2010 and 2011



In 2011 it is noted a decrease in the number of the birth registrations and of the housing cases.

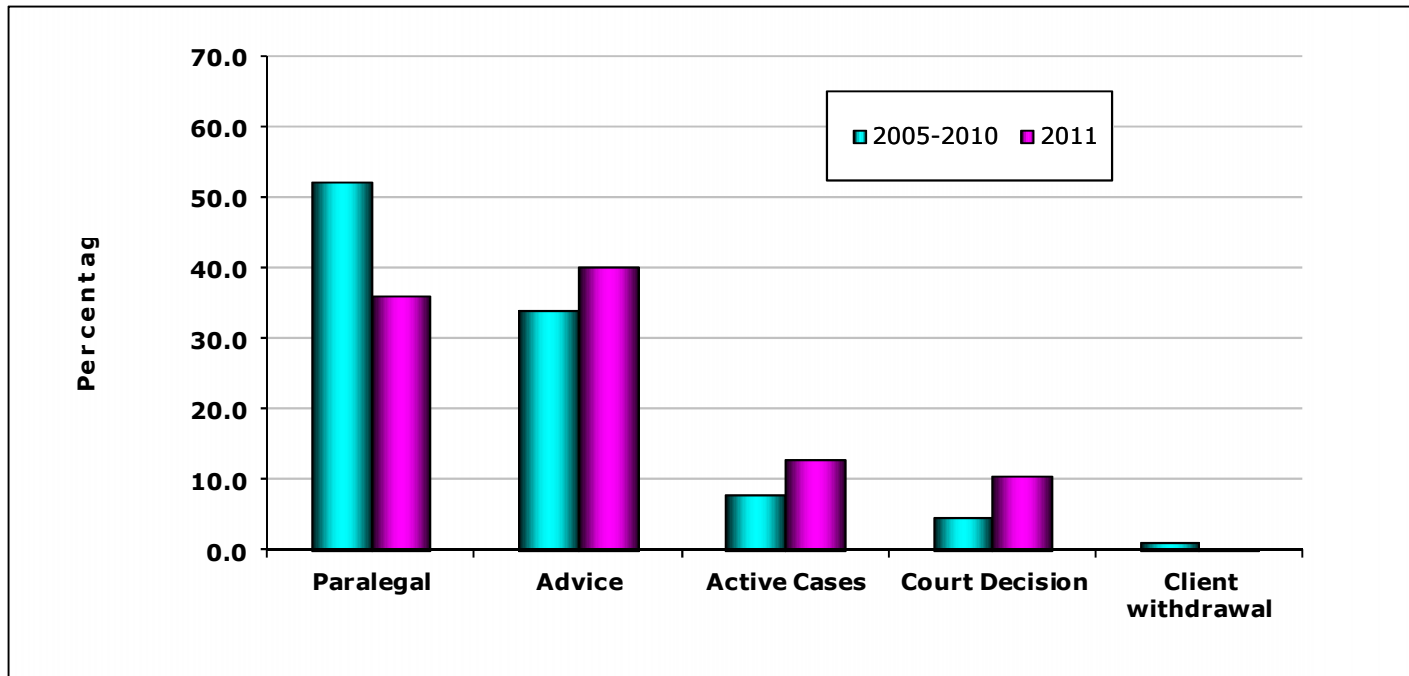
Problems related to the social assistance have increased and the other family law cases.

In 2011, as in previous year, from the active cases 22% are legal cases and 78% are paralegal cases.

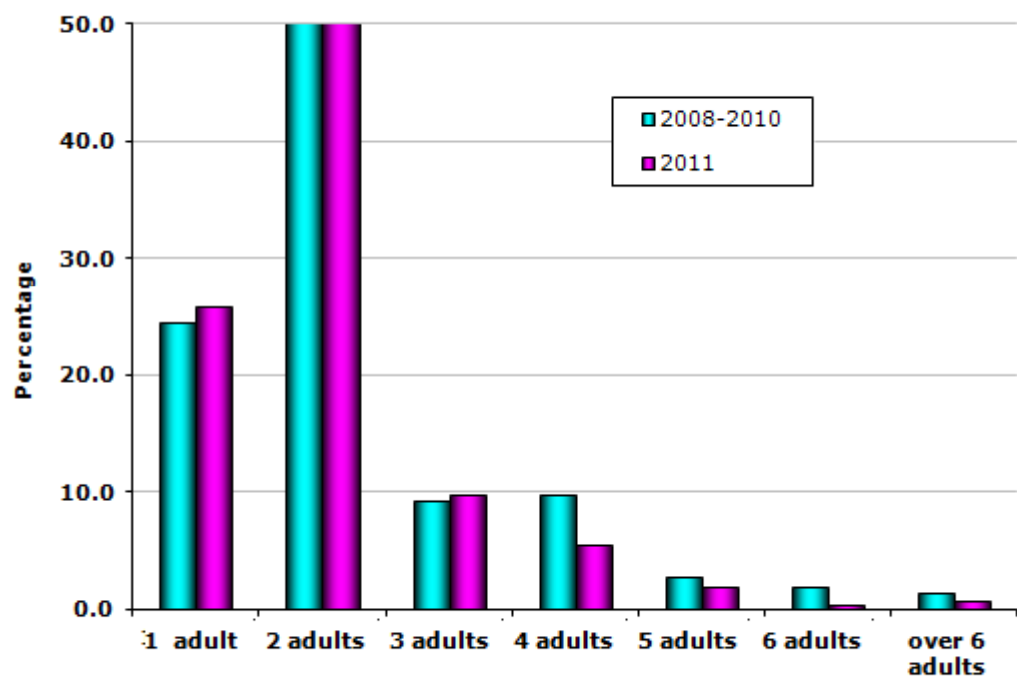
Closed cases progress of Roma Minority clients 2005-2010 and 2011



Prevail the cases closed with the provision of concrete services and legal advice.

The legal cases addressed by TLAS lawyers are concluded with court decisions in favor of the clients.

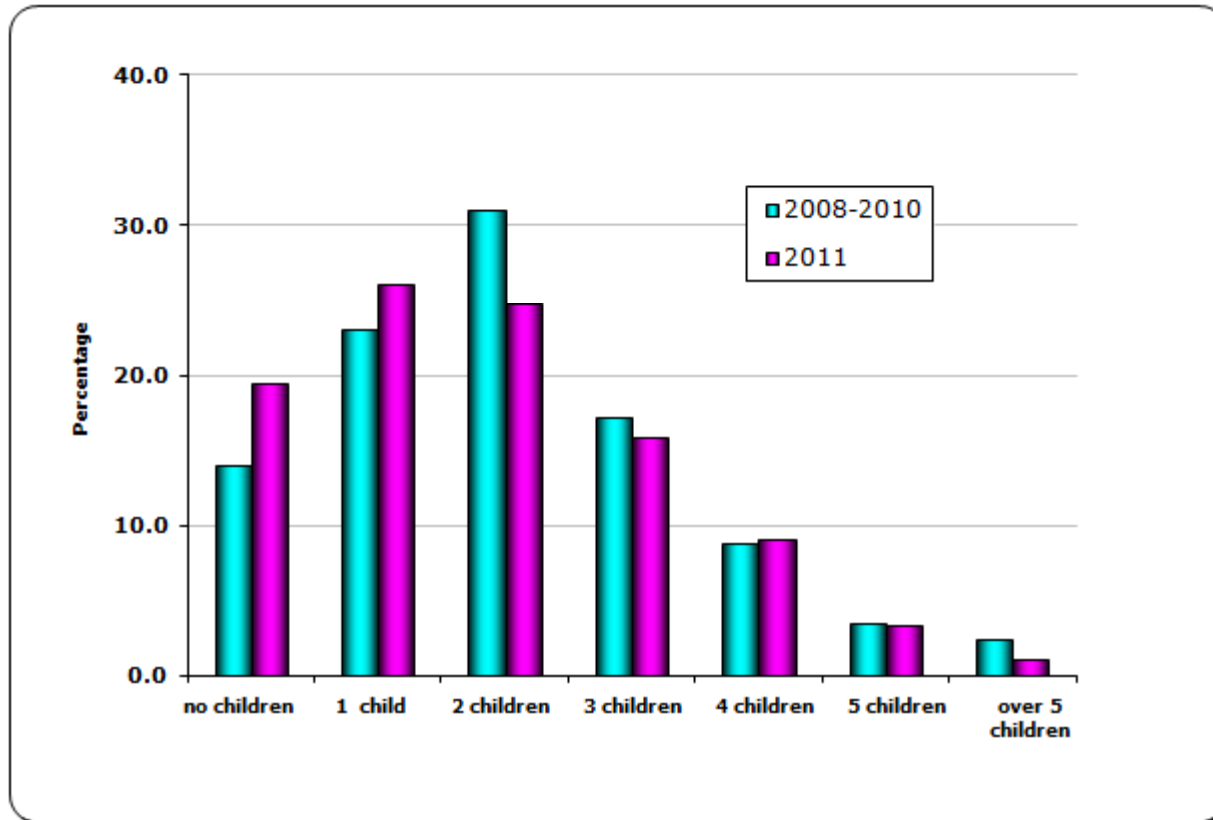
Structure of Roma families by number of adult members 2008-2010 and 2011



In 2011, also, prevail the families with 2 adult members.

It is noted a slight decrease of the number of the families with 3 adult members.

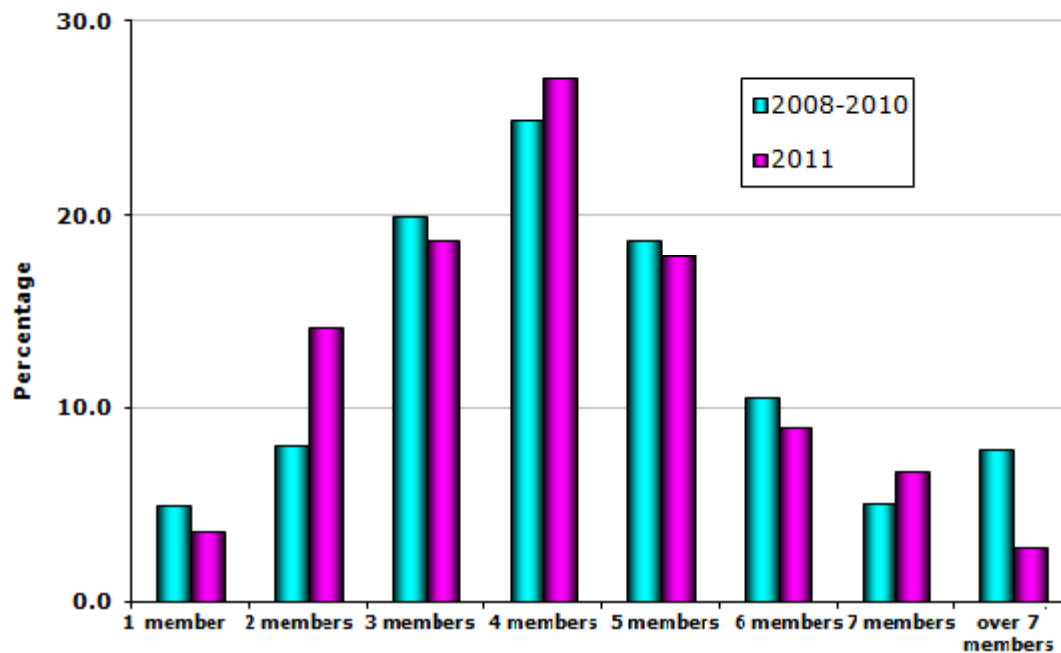
Structure of Roma families by number of children 2008-2010 and 2011



In 2011, the highest number of the families demanding legal services from the Roma families are the families with 1 child.

In 2011, it is recorded a slight decrease of the Roma families with 3 children and no children requesting services.

In 2011, also, prevail the Roma families with 4 members.

It is noted a decrease of the Roma families with 3, 5 and over 7 members, requesting services.

It is noted an increase of the families of 2 and 7 members requesting services.
